INTRODUCTION

These *Electronic* appliances are designed to operate on natural gas and have an electronic intermittent pilot ignition system. External 120 Volt AC electrical power is required to operate these units.

These vented gas fireplaces are sealed combustion gas fireplaces designed for residential, manufactured home, and commercial applications.

Approved Vent Components

These fireplaces are designed, tested and listed for operation and installation with the following vent components only:

- Secure Vent® Direct-Vent System Compo-
- Secure Flex® Flexible Vent Components, and
- Z-FLEX® Model GA Venting Systems listed to UL1777 and ULCS635 manufactured by Flexmaster Canada Limited.

Use only the correct size venting (4-1/2" inner and 7-1/2" outer).

These approved vent system components are labeled for identification. DO NOT use any other manufacturer's vent components with these fireplaces.

GENERAL INFORMATION



Codes and Standards

These appliances comply with National Safety Standards and are tested and listed by PFS TECO (Report No. F14-106) to ANSI Z21.50:19 (in Canada, CSA-2.22:19) as vented gas fireplaces.

These appliances comply with CSA P.4.1-2015 "Testing Method for Measuring Annual Fireplace Efficiency. P4 (EnerGuide) is a measurement of the Canadian Office of Energy Efficiency.



These appliances are listed by PFS TECO for installation in bedrooms and manufactured (mobile) homes.

Installation must conform to local codes. In the absence of local codes, installation must comply with the current National Fuel Gas Code, ANSI Z223.1/NFPA 54 (in Canada, the current CAN/CGA-B149.1 installation code).

The appliance, when installed, must be electrically grounded in accordance with local codes or, in the absence of local codes, with the National Electrical Code, ANSI/NFPA 70 - latest edition, or the Canadian Electrical Code, CSA C22.1 - latest edition.

Provide adequate clearances around air openings and adequate accessibility clearance for service and proper operation. Never obstruct the front openings of the appliance.

These appliances are designed to operate on natural gas. The use of other fuels or combination of fuels will degrade the performance of this system and may be dangerous.

These appliances must not be connected to a chimney or flue serving a separate solid fuel burning appliance.

These electronic appliances are remotely controlled and feature an electronic intermittent pilot ignition system. External electrical power is required to operate these units.

These electronic models come standard with a remotely-modulated gas valve; flame appearance and heat output cannot be controlled at the gas valve. The BTU Input for these appliances is shown in *Table 1*.

Test gauge connections are provided on the front of the gas control valve; identified IN for the inlet and OUT for the manifold side (see *Figure 1*).

The appliance and its appliance main gas valve must be disconnected from the gas supply piping system during any pressure testing of that system at test pressures <u>in</u> excess of 1/2 psi (3.5 kPa).

The appliance must be isolated from the gas supply piping system by closing its equipment shutoff valve during any pressure testing of the gas supply piping system at test pressures **equal to or less than** 1/2 psi (3.5 kPa).

PURGE CYCLE

This is a power vented fireplace that requires household electrical power to operate. It will not operate during a power failure. When the fireplace is turned off, the exhaust blower will continue to operate for approximately fifteen (15) seconds after shutdown to expel the exhaust gases from the venting system.


These appliances are tested and approved for installation at elevations of 0 - 4500 ft (0 - 1370 m) above sea level, using the standard burner orifice sizes (marked with an "*" in *Table 4*). For elevations above 4500 ft, contact your gas supplier or qualified service technician.

Deration - At higher elevations, the amount of BTU fuel value delivered must be reduced by either:

- Using gas that has been derated by the gas company.

COMMONWEALTH OF MASSACHUSETTS REQUIREMENTS

These appliances are approved for installation in the US state of Massachusetts if the following additional requirements are met:

- Install this appliance in accordance with Massachusetts Rules and Regulations 248 C.M.R. Sections 4.00 through 8.00.
- Installation and repair must be done by a plumber or gas fitter licensed in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.
- The flexible gas line connector used shall not exceed 36 inches (92 centimeters) in length.
- The individual manual shut-off must be a T-handle type valve.

Massachusetts Horizontal Vent Requirements In the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, horizontal terminations installed less than seven (7) feet above the finished grade must comply with the following additional requirements:

- A hard wired carbon monoxide detector with an alarm and battery back-up must be installed on the floor level where the gas fireplace is installed. The carbon monoxide detector must comply with NFPA 720, be ANSI/UL 2034 listed and be ISA certified..
- A metal or plastic identification plate must be permanently mounted to the exterior of the building at a minimum height of eight (8) feet above grade and be directly in line with the horizontal termination. The sign must read, in print size no less than one-half (1/2) inch in size, GAS VENT DIRECTLY BELOW. KEEP CLEAR OF ALL OBSTRUCTIONS.

COLD CLIMATE INSULATION

For cold climate installations, seal all cracks around your appliance with noncombustible material and wherever cold air could enter the room. It is especially important to insulate outside chase cavity between studs and under floor on which appliance rests, if floor is above ground level. Gas line holes and other openings should be caulked or stuffed with unfaced fiberglass insulation.

If the fireplace is being installed on a cement slab in cold climates, a sheet of plywood or other raised platform can be placed underneath to prevent cold transfer to the fireplace and into the room. It also helps to sheetrock inside surfaces and tape for maximum air tightness and caulk firestops.

MANUFACTURED HOME REQUIREMENTS

This appliance may be installed in an aftermarket permanently located, manufactured home and must be installed in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions.

LOCATION

In selecting the location, the aesthetic and functional use of the appliance are primary concerns. However, vent system routing to the exterior and access to the fuel supply are also important.

Due to high temperatures, the appliance should be located out of traffic and away from furniture and draperies (Figure 2).



The location should also be free of electrical, plumbing or other heating/air conditioning ducting.

Be aware that this is a heat producing appliance. Objects placed above the unit are exposed to elevated temperatures.

Do not insulate the space between the appliance and the area above it.

The appliance must be mounted on a fully supported base extending the full width and depth of the unit. The appliance may be located on or near conventional construction materials. However, if installed on combustible materials, such as carpeting, vinyl tile, or other combustible material other than wood flooring, the appliance shall be installed on a metal or wood panel extending the full width and depth of the appliance.





VENT TERMINATION CLEARANCES

These instructions should be used as a guideline and do not supersede local codes in any way. Install venting according to local codes, these instructions, and the current (USA) National Fuel Gas Code ANSI-Z223.1 / NFPA 54, or (Canada) CAN/CGA-B149.1 standards.

Horizontal Vent Termination Clearances

The horizontal vent termination must have a minimum of 3" (77 mm) clearance to any overhead combustible projection of 2-1/2" (64 mm) or less (see *Figure 3*). For projections exceeding 2-1/2" (64 mm), see *Figure 3*. For additional vent location restrictions refer to *Figure 4 on Page 9*.


Wall Finishes / Surrounds / Mantels




Figure 6 - Minimum Distance to Unprotected Side Wall

NOTE: Combustible wall finish materials and/or surround materials must not be allowed to encroach the area defined by the appliance front face (black sheet metal). Never allow combustible materials to be positioned in front of or overlapping the appliance face. See Figure 6 and Figure 44 on Page 29.

Noncombustible materials, such as surrounds and other appliance trim, may be installed on the appliance front face with these exceptions: they must not cover any portion of the removable glass panel.

Vertical installation clearances to combustible mantels vary according to the depth of the mantel (see *Figure 5*). Mantels constructed of noncombustible materials may be installed at any height above the appliance. Minimum clearance requirements include any projections such as shelves, window sills, mantels, etc. above the appliance.

NOTE: To avoid heat-related finish damage, we recommend the use of high temperature paint (rated 175° F or higher) on the underside of the mantel.

PRE-INSTALLATION STEPS

The appliance is shipped with all gas controls and components installed and pre-wired.

Before installing the appliance, follow these steps:

- 1. Remove the shipping carton.
- 2. Remove the shipping pad, exposing the barrier and front glass door.

Barrier (see Notice, Page 41)

This fireplace comes with a barrier to reduce the likelihood of burns from touching hot glass. If the barrier is damaged, the fireplace should be turned off immediately and the fireplace must not be operated until a new, approved factory barrier for this unit is installed.

To remove barrier follow these steps.

- A. Lift barrier up by the frame at the top.
- B. Remove lower filler piece by pulling down off of the barrier.
- C. Lower barrier and push barrier to left to release right side.
- D. Pull the right side out of fireplace.
- E. Remove barrier.
- Using a Phillips screwdriver, unfasten the two

 (2) screws located at the top of the glass frame
 (see *Figure 41* on *Page 27*). Tilt the top of the glass frame away from the unit. Lift it carefully off the bottom door track and set the door aside, protecting it from inadvertent damage.
- Remove the embers and volcanic stone from the control compartment (Traditional models).

TYPICAL INSTALLATION SEQUENCE

The typical sequence of installation is outlined below. However, each installation is unique and may result in variations to the steps described.

See the page numbers references in the following steps for detailed procedures.

- **Step 1.** (*Page 11*) Construct the appliance framing. Position the appliance within the framing and secure with nailing brackets.
- **Step 2.** (*Page 13*) Route gas supply line to the right side.
- **Step 3.** (*Page 14*) Install the vent system and exterior termination.
- Step 4. (*Page 21*) Field Wiring

 Connect 120 VAC electrical power to the appliance receptacle.
- **Step 5.** (*Page 23*) Remove glass door assembly.
- **Step 6.** (*Page 24*) Make connection to gas supply.
- **Step 7.** (*Page 24*) Install firebox liner kit (Traditional models).
- Step 8. (Page 24) Verify appliance operation.
- **Step 9.** (*Page 25*) Install volcanic stone, glowing embers, and logs (Traditional models).
- Step 10. (Page 27) Install glass door assembly.
- **Step 11.** (*Page 27*) Adjust burner to ensure proper flame appearance.
- Step 12. (*Page 30*) Attach Safety-in-Operation Warnings.

DETAILED INSTALLATION STEPS


Step 1. FRAMING






Figure 8 - Fireplace and Framing Specifications

Frame these appliances as illustrated in *Figure 8 on Page 12*, unless the appliance is to be installed in a corner. See *Figure 9 on Page 13* for corner framing installations. All framing details must allow for a minimum clearance to combustible framing members as shown in *Table 5 on Page 10*.

If the appliance is to be elevated above floor level, a solid continuous platform must be constructed below the appliance.

Headers may be in direct contact with the appliance top spacers but must not be supported by them or notched to fit around them.

The fireplace should be secured to the side framing members using the unit nailing flanges - one top and bottom on each side of the fireplace front (see **Figure 7**). Use 8d nails or their equivalent.



NOTE: The nailing flanges, combustible members and screw heads located in areas directly adjacent to the nailing flanges, are EXEMPT from the 1/2" clearance to combustible requirements for the firebox outer wrapper. Combustible framing may be in direct contact with the nailing flanges and may be located closer than 1/2" from screw heads and the firebox wrapper in areas adjacent to the nailing flanges. Frame the opening to the exact dimensions specified in the framing details of this manual.

Step 2. ROUTING GAS LINE

Route a 1/2" (13 mm) gas line along the inside of the right side framing as shown in *Figure 10*. Gas lines must be routed, constructed and made of materials that are in strict accordance with local codes and regulations.

All appliances are factory-equipped with a flexible gas line connector and 1/2" shutoff valve. (see **Step 6** on *Page 24*).

Proper Sizing of Gas Line

Properly size and route the gas supply line from the supply regulator to the area where the appliance is to be installed per requirements outlined in the (USA) National Fuel Gas Code, ANSI Z223.1/NFPA 54 - latest edition, or (Canada) CAN/CGA-B149.1 - latest edition.

Never use galvanized or plastic pipe. Refer to *Table 6* for proper sizing of the gas supply line, if black iron pipe is being used.

Gas lines must be routed, constructed and made of materials that are in strict accordance with local codes and regulations. We recommend hiring a qualified plumber or gas fitter to correctly size and route the gas supply line to the appliance. Installing a gas supply line from the fuel supply to the appliance involves numerous considerations of materials, protection, sizing, locations, controls, pressure, sediment, and more. Only a qualified installer should attempt sizing or installing gas pipe.

NOTES

- All appliances are factory-equipped with a flexible gas line connector and 1/2" shutoff valve (see Figure 32 on Page 24).
- See Massachusetts Requirements on Page 6 for additional requirements for installations in the state of Massachusetts in the USA.
- The gas supply line should Not be connected to the appliance until **Step 6** (**Page 24**).
- A pipe joint compound rated for gas should be used on the threaded joints. Be very careful that the pipe compound does not get inside the pipe.
- Installing a sediment trap in the supply line as close as possible to the appliance is recommended.
- Check with local building official for local code requirements.

Step 3. INSTALL THE VENT SYSTEM

General Information

These instructions should be used as a guideline and do not supersede local codes in any way. Install venting according to local codes, these instructions, and the (USA) National Fuel Gas Code, ANSI Z223.1/NFPA 54 - latest edition, or (Canada) CAN/CGA-B149.1 - latest edition.

These fireplaces are designed, tested and listed for operation and installation only with Secure Vent® (SV4.5) Direct-Vent System Components, manufactured by IHP. These approved vent system components are labeled for identification. DO NOT use any other manufacturer's vent components with these appliances.

Ensure clearances are in accordance with local installation codes and the requirements of the gas supplier.



These fireplaces must be vented directly to the outside.

The vent system may not service multiple appliances, and must never be connected to a flue serving a separate solid fuel burning appliance. The vent pipe is tested to be run inside an enclosed wall (such as a chase). There is no requirement for inspection openings in the enclosing wall at any of the joints in the vent pipe.

Venting System

With the appliance secured in framing, determine vent routing and identify the exterior termination location. The following sections describe horizontal (exterior wall) vent applications. A list of approved venting components is shown on *Page 31*.



Power Vent Components

Locate the fireplace as instructed in this manual. Make the following modifications to add the components used with the Power Vent Kit. This kit may only be used in conjunction with Direct-Vent series electronic versions of Innovative Hearth Products Fireplaces. This installation must conform with local codes, or, in the absence of local codes, with the (USA) National Fuel Gas Code, ANSI Z223.1/NFPA 54 - latest edition, or (Canada) CAN/CGA-B149.1 - latest edition.

CAUTION: This power vent kit cannot be used with millivolt appliances. Use the kit only with the electronically controlled fireplaces listed for its use as shown in this document.




Figure 11B - Power Vent Kit Components

VENT SECTION LENGTHS

Determine the number of straight vent sections required. 4-1/2" (114 mm), 10-1/2" (267 mm), 22-1/2" (572 mm), 34-1/2". (876 mm) and 46-1/2" (1181 mm) net section lengths are available (see *Tables 7A and 7B*).

Offset Installation

Analyze the vent routing and determine the quantities of vent sections and number of elbows required. Refer to *Figures 16 and 17 on Page 17* showing vent run requirements to aid in selecting the type of vertical installation desired. Vent sections are available in net lengths of 4-1/2" (114 mm), 10-1/2" (267 mm), 22-1/2" (572 mm), 34-1/2" (876 mm) and 46-1/2" (1181 mm). Refer to the **Vent Section Length Chart** for an aid in selecting length combinations. Elbows are available in 90° and 45° configurations. Refer to *Figure 15 on Page 16* for the SV4.5 E45 and SV4.5 E90 elbow dimensional specifications.

Where required, a **telescopic vent section (SV4.5LA)** may be used to provide the installer with an option in installing in tight and confined spaces or where the vent run made up of fixed length pieces develops a joint in a undesirable location, or will not build up to the required length. The SV4.5LA Telescopic Vent Section has an effective length of from 1-1/2" (38 mm) to 6-3/4" (171 mm). The SV4.5LA is fitted with a dimpled end (identical to a normal vent section component) and a plain end with 3 pilot holes. Slip the dimpled end over the locking channel end of a standard SV4.5 vent component the required distance and secure with three screws.

Maintain a minimum 1" (26 mm) clearance to combustible materials for all vertical elements. Clearances for all horizontal elements are 3" (77 mm) on top, 1" (26 mm) on sides and 1" (26 mm) on the bottom.



A. Frame ceiling opening - Use a plumb line from the ceiling above the appliance to locate center of the vertical run. Cut and/or frame an opening, 10-1/2" x 10-1/2" (267 mm x 267 mm) inside dimensions, about this center mark (*Figure 12*).




Figure 13 - Attaching the Vent Adaptor

B. Attach adaptor (with probe) to appliance collar - Secure Vent® SV4.5 direct-vent system components are unitized concentric pipe components featuring positive twist lock connections (see *Figure 13*).

All of the appliances covered in this document are fitted with collars having locking inclined channels. The dimpled end of the adaptor fits over the appliance collar to create the positive twist lock connection.

To attach a vent component to the adaptor on appliance collar, align the dimpled end over the adaptor collar, adjusting the radial alignment until the four locking dimples are aligned with the inlet of the four inclined channels on the collar (refer to *Figure 13*). Push the vent component against the collar until it fully engages, then twist the component clockwise, running the dimples down and along the incline channels until they seat at the end of the channels.

The unitized design of the Secure Vent® components will engage and seal both the inner and outer pipe without the need for sealant or screws. If desired a #6 x 1/2" screw may be used at the joint, but it is not required as the pipe will securely lock when twisted.

C. Attach vent components to each other - Other vent sections may be added to the previously installed section in accordance with the requirements shown in *Figures 16 and 17 on Page 17*.

To add another vent component to a length of vent run, align the dimpled end over the inclined channel end of the previously installed section, adjusting the radial alignment until the four locking dimples are aligned with the inlets of the four incline channels of the previous section.

Push the vent component against the previous section until it fully engages, then twist the component clockwise running the dimples down and along the incline channels until they seat at the end of the channels. This seating position is indicated by the alignment of the arrow and dimple as shown in Figure 13.

D. Install firestop/spacer at ceiling - When using Secure Vent, use SV4.5VF firestop/spacer at ceiling joists. If there is living space above the ceiling level, the firestop/spacer must be installed on the bottom side of the ceiling. If attic space is above the ceiling, the firestop/spacer must be installed on the top side of the joist. Route the vent sections through the framed opening and secure the firestop/spacer with 8d nails or other appropriate fasteners at each corner.

A firestop spacer is required.

Maintain 1" (26 mm) clearance to combustibles, framing members, and attic or ceiling insulation when running vertical chimney sections. Attic insulation shield (H3907) may be used to obtain the required clearances indicated here. See installation accessories on *Page 31*. The gap between the vent pipe and a vertical firestop may be sealed with noncombustible caulking.





Figure 14 - Supporting Vertical Vents

E. Support the vertical vent run sections -

Support the vertical portion of the venting system every eight feet (2.4 m) above the fireplace vent outlet. One method of support is by utilizing field provided support straps (conventional plumber's tape). Secure the plumber's tape to the framing members with nails or screws. Strap the tape around the vent, securing the ends of the tape to the framing. If desired, sheet metal screws #6 x 1/2" length may be used to secure the support straps to the vent pipe.

F. Change vent direction to horizontal/inclined run - At transition from or to a horizontal/inclined run, install the SV4.5E45 and SV4.5E90 elbows in the same manner as the straight vent sections. The elbows feature a twist section to allow them to be routed about the center axis of their initial collar section to align with the required direction of the next vent run element. Twist elbow sections in a clockwise direction only so as to avoid the possibility of unlocking any of the previously connected vent sections (see Figures 13 and 15).



G. Continue installation of horizontal/inclined sections - Continue with the installation of the straight vent sections in horizontal/inclined run as described in **Step C.** Install support straps every three feet (914 mm) along horizontal/inclined vent runs using conventional plumber's tape (*Figure 16* on *Page 17*).

NOTE: Maintain the horizontal/inclined run in a straight, slightly elevated plane - approximately 1/4" per foot (20 mm per meter) - in a direction away from the fireplace. Smaller rise per foot run ratios are acceptable, down to at or near level. Use a carpenter's level to measure from a constant surface and adjust the support straps as necessary.


NOTE: Maintain the required clearances to combustibles: 1" (26 mm) at all sides for all vertical runs; and 3" (77 mm) at the top, 1" (26 mm) at sides, and 1" (26 mm) at the bottom for all horizontal/inclined runs.

NOTE: Attic insulation shield (H3907, see Page 31) must be installed when blown or loose-fill insulation is used, and is required for all attic installations.



HORIZONTAL (OUTSIDE WALL) TERMINATION SYSTEM

See Figures 16 and 17 on Page 17 illustrating the various horizontal venting configurations that are possible for use with these appliances. **Table 9 on Page 17** shows each system's minimum and maximum vertical and horizontal length values that can be used to design and install the vent components in a variety of applications.

The horizontal vent system terminates through an outside wall. Building codes limit or prohibit terminating in specific areas. Refer to *Figure 4 on Page 9* for location guidelines.

Secure Vent® SV4.5 direct-vent system components are unitized concentric pipe components featuring positive twist lock connection, (refer to *Figure 13 on Page 16*). All of the appliances covered in this document are fitted with collars having locking inclined channels. The dimpled end of the vent components fit over the appliance collar to create the positive twist lock connection.

A. Plan the vent run -

Analyze the vent routing and determine the types and quantities of sections required 4-1/2" (114 mm), 10-1/2" (267 mm), 22-1/2" (572 mm), 34-1/2" (876 mm) and 46-1/2" (1181 mm) net section lengths are available. Make allowances for elbows as indicated in *Figure 15 on Page 16*.

Maintain a minimum 1" (26 mm) clearance to combustibles on the vertical sections. Clearances for the horizontal runs are: 3" (77 mm) on top, 1". (26 mm) on sides, and 1" (26 mm) at the bottom.

B. Frame exterior wall opening -

Locate the center of the vent outlet on the exterior wall according to the dimensions shown in *Figure 8 on Page 12*.

Cut and/or frame an opening, 10-1/2" x 12-1/8" ($267\,\text{mm}\,\text{x}\,308\,\text{mm}$) inside dimensions, about this center.

C. Frame ceiling opening - If the vertical route is to penetrate a ceiling, use a plumb line to locate the center above the appliance. Cut and/or frame an opening, 10-1/2" x 10-1/2" (267 mm x 267 mm) inside dimensions, about this center (see *Figure 12* on *Page 16*)

D. Attach vent components to appliance - To attach a vent component to the appliance collar, align the dimpled end over the collar, adjusting the radial alignment until the four locking dimples are aligned with the inlets of the four incline channels on the collar (refer to Figure 13 on Page 16).

Push the vent component against the collar until it fully engages, then twist the component clockwise, running the dimples down and along the incline channels until they seat at the end of the channels. The unitized design of the Secure Vent components will engage and seal both the inner and outer pipe elements with the same procedure. Sealant and securing screws are not required.

E. Attach vent components to each other -Other vent sections may be added to the previously installed section in accordance with the requirements of the vent tables. To add another vent component to a length of vent run, align the dimpled end of the component over the inclined channel end of the previously installed section, adjusting the radial alignment until the four locking dimples are aligned with the inlets of the four incline channels of the previous section. Push the vent component against the previous section until it fully engages, then twist the component clockwise running the dimples down and along the incline channels until they seat at the end of the channels. This seating position is indicated by the alignment of the arrow and dimple as shown in Figure 13 on Page 16.

F. Install firestop/spacer at ceiling -

When using Secure Vent, use SV4.5VF fire-stop/spacer at ceiling joists. If there is living space above the ceiling level, the firestop/spacer must be installed on the bottom side of the ceiling. If attic space is above the ceiling, the firestop/spacer must be installed on the top side of the joist. Route the vent sections through the framed opening and secure the firestop/spacer with 8d nails or other appropriate fasteners at each corner. The gap between the vent pipe and a firestop can be sealed with noncombustible caulking.

Maintain 1" (26 mm) clearance to combustibles, framing members, and attic or ceiling insulation when running vertical chimney sections.

G. Support the vertical run sections -

On the vertical run, support the venting system every eight feet (2.4 m) above the fireplace vent outlet with field provided support straps (Plumber's tape). Attach the straps to the vent pipe and secure to the framing members with nails or screws.

- H. Change vent direction At transitions from or to a horizontal/inclined run, install the SV4.5E45 and SV4.5E90 elbows in the same manner as the straight vent sections. The elbows feature a twist section to allow them to be routed about the center axis of their initial collar section to align with the required direction of the next vent run element. Twist elbow sections in a clockwise direction only so as to avoid the possibility of unlocking any of the previously connected vent sections (see Figure 13 on Page 16).
- I. Continue installation of horizontal/inclined sections Continue with the installation of the straight vent sections in horizontal/inclined run as described in **Step E**. Install support straps every three feet (1914 mm) along horizontal/inclined vent runs using conventional plumber's tape (see *Figure 16 on Page 17*).

NOTE: Maintain the horizontal/inclined run in a straight, slightly elevated plane - approximately 1/4" per foot (20 mm per meter) - in a direction away from the fireplace. Smaller rise per foot run ratios are acceptable, down to at or near level. Use a carpenter's level to measure from a constant surface and adjust the support straps as necessary.

Installing Power Vent Termination

J. Assemble vent run to exterior wall - If not previously measured, locate the center of the vent on the exterior wall. Prepare an opening as described in this manual. Assemble the vent system to a point where the terminus of the last section is within 8" of the outside wall surface where the power vent is to be mounted (see Figure 18 on Page 19).




Figure 19 - Venting Connection and Exterior Wall Recessing of the Power Vent Horizontal Termination

If the terminus of the last section is not within this distance, use the **telescopic vent section SV4.5LA**, as the last vent section. For wall thicknesses greater than that shown in *Figure 19 on Page 19*, refer to *Table 11 on Page 19* for the additional venting components needed (in addition to the termination and adaptor) for a particular range of wall thicknesses.

K. Attach termination adaptor - Attach the adaptor (SV4.5RCH - provided with the power vent kit) to the vent section telescoping vent section, or elbow, as shown in *Figures 18* and 19 on Page 17 in the same manner as any SV4.5 vent component. L. Install Firestop/Spacer at exterior wall Install SV4.5HF Firestop/Spacer, provided
with the power vent kit, over the opening at
the exterior side of the framing, long side
up, with the 3" spacer clearance at the top as
shown in *Figure 18*, and nail into place. The
Firestop/Spacer may also be installed over
the opening at the interior side of the framing. The gap between the vent pipe and a
firestop can be sealed with noncombustible
caulking.

(The Firestop/Spacer may also be installed over the opening at the interior side of the framing).

M. Install the Power Vent termination - From outside the exterior wall, slide the collars of the termination onto the adaptor until the termination seats against the exterior wall surface to which it will be attached. Orient the housing of the termination with the arrow pointed upwards. Secure the termination to the exterior wall. The termination must not be recessed into the exterior wall or siding by more that the 1-1/4" (32 mm) as shown in *Figure 19*.


The Power Vent termination has been designed to perform in a wide range of weather conditions. Terminations meet or exceed industry standards.

When selecting the location of termination, do not place the termination where water from eaves and adjoining roof lines may create a heavy flow of cascading water onto the termination. If the termination must be placed where the possibility of cascading water exists, it is the responsibility of the builder to direct the water away from the termination cap by using gutters or other means.

Carefully follow the Installation Instructions for the termination, including the use of silicone caulking where required.

See Table 11 as an aid in venting component selection for a particular range of exterior wall thicknesses.

WARNING: The vent termination is hot while in operation and for a period of time following the use of the fireplace. Young children should be carefully supervised when in the same area as a hot termination.

VERTICAL OR HORIZONTAL VENTING USING SECURE FLEX® KITS AND COMPONENTS

When **Secure Flex**® kits are used in a rear flue, horizontal termination installation, at least 1 ft of vertical rise is required.

Secure Flex venting kits and components may be used in any other vent installation where rigid Secure Vent® (SV4.5) direct-vent components can be used. All restrictions, clearances and allowances pertaining to rigid vent also apply to flexible vent. Do NOT modify Secure Flex kits. Secure Flex kits can be installed on the end of a Secure Vent (SV4.5) rigid vent run, provided that doing so does not violate any of the venting length, height, routing, horizontal to vertical ratio requirements, or clearance considerations detailed in this manual. When combined, a rigid vent should not be installed between two flexible vents.

Secure Flex kits come with an included adaptor that can be installed on the fireplace collar or the inclined channel end of the last Secure Vent (SV4.5) vent section in a rigid system in the exact same fashion as any other Secure Vent section. Align the dimpled end of the adaptor over the previously installed section or fireplace collar, adjusting the radial alignment until the four locking dimples of the adaptor are aligned with the inlets of the four incline channels of the last vent section or collar. Push on the adaptor until it is fully engaged, then twist the adaptor clockwise running the dimples down and along the incline channels until they seat at the end of the channels.

- **1.** Install the Inner Flex Pipe.
- **a.** Install the small gear clamp loosely around the inner flexible vent, then push it back out of the way.
- **b.** Apply a bead of Mill-Pac Black (700 °F) high temperature sealant (P/N 10K81) to the inner adaptor collar, approximately 1/2" from the end.
- c. Pull and extend the inner flexible vent.
- **d.** Slide the inner flex vent over the adaptor collar at least 1-3/4".

NOTE: Ensure the flex vent is free from damage or tears.

- **e.** Slide the gear clamp down and tighten it fully to secure the flexible vent to the adaptor inner collar approximately 3/4" from the end of the flex.
- **f.** Install three (3) sheet metal screws 120° apart through the flexible vent and into the adaptor collar just below the gear clamp to provide additional security to the connection.
- **2.** Install the outer Flex Pipe.
 - **a.** Install the large gear clamp loosely around the outer flexible vent pipe, then push it back out of the way.
 - **b.** Apply a bead of Mill-Pac Black (700 °F) high temperature sealant (P/N 10K81) to the outer adaptor collar. Cover to the grooves of the collar that extend approximately 1" from the end and to the flat surface, approximately

- 1-3/8" from the end.
- c. Pull and extend the outer flexible vent.
- **d.** Slide the outer flexible vent over the adaptor collar. Ensure the flexible vent completely engages the adaptor collar 1-3/4" from the end, and that it is free from damage or tears.
- e. Slide the gear clamp down and tighten it fully to secure the flexible vent to the adaptor outer collar approximately 3/4" from the end of the flexible vent.
- **f.** Install three (3) sheet metal screws 120° apart through the flexible vent and into the adaptor collar just below the gear clamp to provide additional security to the connection.
- **3.** Route the flexible vent.

NOTE: Ensure that the flexible vent is properly routed to provide the required clearance. Do NOT allow the flexible vent to bend in a radius tighter than 5" (127 mm) (**Figure 21**).

Place the internal flexible vent spacers evenly and avoid kinking the inner vent. Support horizontal sections of flexible vent with metal straps at 2 ft (0.61 m) intervals.


- **4.** Install firestop/spacers at ceiling and wall penetrations.
 - SF4.5VF firestop/spacer for ceilings
 - SF4.5HF firestop/spacer for walls

NOTE: See the appropriate sections and figures shown throughout the venting section for installation requirements.

5. Attach the flexible vent to the termination.
NOTE: Secure Flex® components can be purchased separately and attached to bulk lengths of Secure Flex flexible vent cut to size at the job site. Attach the flexible vent to the Secure Flex terminations as it was attached

to the adaptor (Figure 20).

NOTE: Attach Secure Flex vent to Secure Flex terminations only. Do NOT substitute Secure Vent terminations or Secure Vent adaptor for Secure Flex components. Secure Flex termination and adaptor collars are a different circumference than Secure Vent collars. Secure Flex vent has an longer center tube to improve ease-of-installation.



Step 4. FIELD WIRING

CAUTION: Label all wires prior to disconnection when servicing controls. Wiring errors can cause improper and dangerous operation.

CAUTION: Ground supply lead must be connected to the wire attached to the green ground screw located on the outlet box. See *Figures 27 and 28 on Page 22*. Failure to do so will result in a potential safety hazard. The appliance must be electrically grounded in accordance with local codes or, in the absence of local codes, the (USA) National Electrical Code, ANSI/NFPA 70 - latest edition, or the Canadian Electrical Code, CSA C22.1 - latest edition.

Route Cable

NOTE: Electrical wiring must be performed by a qualified electrician.






Figure 22 - Routing Wiring

- Install the strain relief in the hole provided on the right side of fireplace for the electrical wiring (see Figure 22).





Figure 25 - Bottom of Termination

- Either use the intgrated junction box, or position an electrical junction box (not provided) within reach of the termination wiring pigtail (see Figure 25 on Page 22). Route the pigtail to the junction box as the termination is installed.
- Route 14 gage AWG grounded solid wire Romex® or equally-sized stranded cable (e.g., SJOT) from the fireplace to the newly installed junction box near the termination. Ensure the cable is safety plated to prevent damage from framing nails and finish drywall screws. Route it into the lower control compartment and cut to length before installing the terminals. Install provided hardware on the ends of the cable. Cable is not provided. The provided crimp terminals are intended for use with stranded cable. If using Romex, connect per National Electric Code or local code.




Figure 27 - Back of Termination

- Refer to Figure 27 on Page 22 and install the electrical hardware on the ends of the cable. Male terminals on the Black and White wires, and ring terminals on the ground wire.
- Using standard electrical practices and the terminals provided, connect the three wires of the cable to the termination pigtail within the Electrical junction box. Ensure ground.
- The fireplace end of the cable will be addressed in Connecting The Power Vent To The Fireplace Control System.

Wiring - Fireplace (See Figures 29 and 30 on Page 23)

NOTE: These electronic appliances must be connected to the main power supply. The gas valve is set in place and pre-wired at the factory.

- Route a 3-wire 120 Vac 60 Hz 1ph power supply to the appliance junction box.
- Remove the electrical inlet cover plate from the side of the unit by removing the plate securing screws (see Figure 8 on Page 12).
- 3. Remove the cover plate knockout and then feed the power supply through the knockout opening and into the unit junction box.
- Connect the black power supply to the power outlet red pigtail lead and the white power supply to the common terminal of the outlet as shown in Figures 29 and 30 on Page 23.
- Connect the ground supply to the pigtail lead attached to outlet green ground screw.
- 6. Wall-mounted ON/REMOTE/OFF burner control switch and remote control kits may be used. Mount the switch in a convenient location on a wall near the fireplace.

NOTE: One end of the supplied wire (15 ft) is factory-connected and the other end is attached to the side of the unit.

CAUTION: Do Not connect the ON/REMOTE/OFF wall switch to a 120 V power supply.

- 8. Turn the wall-mounted ON/REMOTE/OFF burner control switch to the OFF position.
- **9**. After the wiring is complete, replace the cover plate.

Wiring - Power Vent Termination

Alternate Instructions (For use when access to the termination is easy and a secondary electrical junction box installation is not desired).

- Remove the junction box cover from the termination by removing the attaching screw (see *Figure 25*).
- Loosen the strain relief on the termination shown in Figure 27. Pull
 the pigtail in and shorten it to fit within the junction box cover.

WARNING: Crimp connectors may be used on stranded cables (such as SJOT cable) only. Solid wire Romex must be connected per the National Electric Code, NEC 70 - latest version, or local codes.

 Route 14 gage AWG grounded solid wire Romex or equally sized stranded cable (e.g., SJOT) from the fireplace to the newly installed junction box near the termination. Ensure the cable is safety plated to prevent damage from framing nails and finish drywall screws. Route it into the lower control compartment and cut to length before installing the terminals. Install provided hardware on the ends of the cable. Cable is not provided. The provided crimp terminals are intended for use with stranded cable. If using Romex, connect per National Electric Code or local code.






Figure 28 - Junction Box Cover Removed

- Refer to Figure 28 and install the electrical hardware on the fireplace end of the cable. Male terminals (#10) on the Black and White wires, and ring terminals (#9) on the ground. The termination end of the cable will be connected to the termination with wire nuts (not provided).
- Refer to Figure 28 to connect the three wires of the cable to the termination. Ensure the ground ring terminal is grounded beneath a structural screw as shown. Attach the junction box cover to the termination with the screw previously removed.
- The fireplace end of the cable will be addressed in Connecting The Power Vent To The Fireplace Control System.

Step 5. REMOVE THE GLASS DOOR ASSEMBLY

WARNING

- Handle this glass with extreme care! Glass is susceptible to damage - Do not scratch or handle roughly.
- Do not attempt to substitute the materials used on this door, or replace cracked or broken glass with any materials other than those provided by the appliance manufacturer.
- The glass door of this appliance must only be replaced as a complete unit as provided by the manufacturer. Do not attempt to replace broken, cracked, or chipped glass separately.

Refer to Figure 41 on Page 27 and remove the front glass door assembly as follows:

Barrier (see Notice, Page 41)

This fireplace comes with a barrier to reduce the likelihood of burns from touching hot glass. If the barrier is damaged, the fireplace should be turned off immediately and the fireplace must not be operated until a new, approved factory barrier for this unit is installed.

To remove barrier follow these steps.

- A.Lift barrier up by the frame at the top.
- B.Remove lower filler piece by pulling down off of the barrier.
- C.Lower barrier and push barrier to left to release right side.
- D.Pull the right side out of fireplace.
- E.Remove barrier.

Using a Phillips screwdriver, unfasten the two (2) screws located at the top of the glass door assembly.

Tilt the glass door assembly at the top away from the unit. Lift it carefully off the bottom door track and set the glass door assembly aside, protecting it from inadvertent damage.

Step 6. CONNECTING GAS LINE

All codes require a shut-off valve mounted in the supply line. The orientation of the shut-off valve should face the front. *Figure 32* illustrates two methods for connecting the gas supply. A Sediment Trap is recommended to prevent moisture and debris in gas line from damaging the valve.

The flex-line method is acceptable in the USA where local codes permit. Installation must be in compliance with local codes. These appliances are equipped with a gas flex-line for use in connecting the unit to the gas line. See *Figure 32* for flex-line description.


A manual shutoff valve is also provided with the flex-line. The gas control valve is located on the right side of the unit.

When using solid gas line connector, access the valve by removing the front door assembly on the valve access side and the access plate (see *Figure 31*).

The electronic control valve has a 3/8" (10 mm) NPT thread gas supply inlet.

Secure all joints tightly using appropriate tools and sealing compounds.

Bring the shutoff valve on the end of the flex-line over to the hard pipe and tighten with wrenches from above through the firebox opening.

Never use an open flame to check for leaks.


Turn on gas supply and test for gas leaks using a gas leak test solution (also referred to as bubble leak solution).

NOTE: Using a soapy water solution is an effective leak test solution but it is not recommended, because the soap residue that is left on the pipes/fittings can result in corrosion over time.

A. Light the appliance (refer to the lighting instructions label in control compartment or in the Installation and Operation instructions manual).

NOTE: Lighting Instructions are also found on the literature tag tied to the bracket above the gas valve. To access the tag, reach into the right side opening.

When first lighting the appliance, it will take a few minutes for the line to purge itself of air. Once purging is complete, the pilot and burner will light and operate as indicated in the instruction manual. Subsequent lighting of the appliance will not require such purging. Inspect the pilot flame (remove logs, if necessary, handling carefully).



- **B.** Brush all joints and connections with the gas leak test solution to check for leaks. If bubbles are formed, or gas odor is detected, turn the unit off. Either tighten or refasten the leaking connection, then retest as described above.
- **C.** When the gas lines are tested and leak free be sure to rinse off the leak testing solution.
- **D.** Re-install the access plate, making certain the gasket has not been damaged.

Step 7. INSTALL FIREBOX LINER KIT (Traditional models)

Install the firebox liner kit per the included instructions.

Step 8. VERIFYING APPLIANCE OPERATION


Turn on burner then observe the individual tongues of flame on the burner. Make sure all ports are open and producing flame evenly across the burner. If any ports are blocked, or partially blocked, clean out the ports.

With gas line installed run initial system checkout before closing up the front of the unit. Follow the pilot lighting instructions provided.

Electronic Appliance Checkout

To light the burner, turn the ON/REMOTE/OFF wall switch or remote control to the ON position. Ensure the igniter lights the pilot. The pilot flame should engulf the flame sensor as shown in *Figure 33*.

NOTE: The control must detect the pressure switch in the open state, at startup, and then close after the blower starts.



Step 9. INSTALL VOLCANIC STONE, GLOWING EMBERS, AND LOGS

A WARNING

- DO NOT operate this appliance without the required accessories properly installed:
 - floor (log set or contemporary kit), and
 panels (ceramic or porcelain).

WARNING

- DO NOT attempt to install the logs until the appliance installation has been completed, the gas line connected and tested for leaks and the initial burner operation has been checked out.
- The size and position of the log set was engineered to give the appliance a safe, reliable and attractive flame pattern. Any attempt to use a different log set in the fireplace will void the warranty and will result in incomplete combustion, sooting, and poor flame quality.
- Logs get very hot and will remain hot up to one hour after gas supply is turned off. Handle only when logs are cool. Turn off all electricity to the appliance before you install grate, volcanic stone, embers and logs.
- This appliance is not designed to burn wood. Any attempt to do so could cause irreparable damage to the appliance and prove hazardous to your safety.
- If logs are not installed according to the log installation instructions, flame impingement and improper combustion could occur and result in soot and/or excessive production of carbon monoxide (CO), a colorless, odorless, toxic gas.

NOTE: It is important to ensure proper log placement per the manual when installing these units. Verify pilot flame is not obstructed. See Verifying Appliance Operation Page 24.

- **Step 1.** Install the ceramic or porcelain panels per the instructions provided in kit.
- Step 2. Place volcanic stone around the burner (the entire bag of volcanic stone will NOT be used). DO NOT PLACE VOLCANIC STONE ON THE BURNER. See Figure 34.




Figure 35 - Separating Glowing Embers






Figure 36 - Glowing Ember Placement

- **Step 3.** Separate the glowing embers (rockwool) into pieces about the size of a quarter (*Figure 35*). Keep the pieces fluffed, not matted. Distribute these pieces over the burner as shown in *Figure 36*. Do not use more than is necessary. When properly positioned, the glowing embers will cover approximately 75% of the burner.
- **Step 4.** Distribute the platinum embers over the burner as desired. Do not use more than is necessary.


NOTE: Excessive use of embers may result in sooting or poor flame. This appliance is provided with enough embers for several applications, do not use all that is in a new bag. For best glowing effect, replace the ember material annually. Replacement volcanic stone, glowing embers, and platinum embers are available.

Step 5. Position the individual logs as shown in *Figures 37 through 40*.

Logs should be placed in the order shown. Place logs 2 and 3 against the pins on the grate, NOT over them.

Proper log and twig placement is critical to encourage outstanding flame appearance and prevent sooting. When positioned properly, as shown, twigs will be positioned between flame peaks and will not impinge any flames.

Figure 34 - Volcanic Stone Placement

Figure 38 - Placing Log 2





Figure 39 - Placing Logs 3 and 4

Step 10. INSTALLATION AND REMOVAL OF GLASS DOOR

A WARNING

- When reinstalling the glass door, the door latch screws must be securely tightened to prevent the glass door from falling out, which could potentially cause damage and possible injury.
- Do not attempt to substitute the materials used on this door, or replace cracked or broken glass.
- Handle this glass with extreme care! Glass is susceptible to damage - Do not scratch or handle roughly while reinstalling the glass door frame.
- The glass door of this appliance must only be replaced as a complete unit as provided by the manufacturer. Do not attempt to replace broken, cracked or chipped glass separately.
- Do not attempt to touch the front enclosure glass with your hands while the fireplace is in use.

Do not operate appliance with the glass front removed, cracked or broken.




Figure 41 - Installing the Glass Door

Installing Glass Enclosure Panel (see Figure 41)

To install the front glass door assembly, proceed as follows:

- Retrieve the glass door assembly. Visually inspect the gasket on the backside of the panel. The gasket surface must be clean, free of irregularities and seated firmly.
- 2. Position the door frame in front of the firebox opening and engage the bottom flange over the rail at the bottom of the firebox opening.
- Swing the door up and back. Ensure the gasket seats evenly as the door draws shut. Engage the nut insert and fasten with two screws to secure the door.
- 4. Install the door modesty shield on top flange glass door as follows: grab the door modesty shield with both hands, with the open hem going down and engage it with the upper lip of the glass door frame by pushing it all the way down. Make sure the installed shield is firmly in place.

WHEN INSTALLING THE GLASS DOOR, SE-CURELY TIGHTEN THE LATCH SCREWS - SEE THE FIRST WARNING ON THIS PAGE.

Barrier (see Notice, Page 41)

This fireplace comes with a barrier to reduce the likelihood of burns from touching hot glass. If the barrier is damaged, the fireplace should be turned off immediately and the fireplace must not be operated until a new, approved factory barrier for this unit is installed.

To remove barrier follow these steps.

- 1.Lift barrier up by the frame at the top.
- 2.Remove lower filler piece by pulling down off of the barrier.
- 3.Lower barrier and push barrier to left to release right side.
- 4.Pull the right side out of fireplace.
- 5. Remove barrier.
- 6. Install the new, approved factory barrier with flat side of barrier toward firebox.

Step 11. BURNER ADJUSTMENTS

Flame Appearance and sooting

Proper flame appearance is a flame which is blue at the base and becomes yellow-orange in the body of the flame. When the appliance is first lit, the entire flame may be blue and will gradually turn yellow-orange during the first 15 minutes of operation. After 15 minutes of operation, if the flame is blue, or if the flame is orange with evidence of sooting (black tip), the air shutter opening may need to be adjusted.

If the air shutter opening is closed too far, sooting may develop. Sooting is indicated by black puffs developing at the tips of very long orange flames. Sooting results in black deposits forming on the logs, appliance inside surfaces and on exterior surfaces adjacent to the vent termination.

Sooting is caused by incomplete combustion in the flames and lack of combustion air entering the air shutter opening. To achieve a warm yellow-orange flame with an orange body that does not soot, the shutter opening must be adjusted between these two positions.

Air Shutter Adjustment Guidelines

- If there is smoke or soot present, first check the log set positioning to ensure that the flames are not impinging on any of the logs.
 If the log set is properly positioned and a sooting condition still exists, then the air shutter opening should be increased.
- The more offsets in the vent system, the larger the air shutter opening will need to be.

 An appliance operated with the air shutter opened too far, may have flames that appear blue and transparent. These weak, blue and transparent flames are termed anemic.

The following chart is provided to aid in correctly adjusting the air shutter.

- Air shutter adjustment should only be performed by a qualified professional service technician.
- Ensure that the front glass door assembly is in place and sealed After adjustment.


A CAUTION

Soot will be produced if the air shutter is closed too much. Any damage due to carboning resulting from improperly setting the air shutter is not covered under the warranty.

To adjust the flame, move the adjustment air shutter (located on the lower venturi) back or forward to increase or reduce the air shutter opening, respectively. Position the air shutter to the factory setting as shown in *Figure 42*. Allow the burner to operate for at least 15 minutes. Observe the flame continuously. If it appears weak or sooty as previously described, adjust the air shutter until the flame appearance is as desired.

When satisfied that the appliance operates properly, finish the installation. Leave the ON/REMOTE/OFF wall switch in the REMOTE position and turn the remote switch OFF.

Use the remote to adjust the flame height as desired.






Figure 43 - Burner Flame Appearance



A hearth extension is not required with this appliance. If a hearth extension is used, there are two methods of installation:

Noncombustible materials, such as surrounds and other appliance trim, may be installed on the appliance front face with the exceptions.

Vertical installation clearances to combustible mantels vary according to the depth of the mantel (see *Figure 5 on Page 10*). Mantels constructed of noncombustible materials may be installed at any height above the appliance opening.

Combustible materials may project beyond the side of the fireplace opening as long as it is kept within the shaded area illustrated in *Figure 6 on Page 10*.



NOTE: A finish trim piece is shipped with your fireplace to extend the base 1/2" to be flush with the finish flanges on the side of the fireplace. This filler is shipped on top of the fireplace wrapped in foam. If desired this piece can be placed on the base of the fireplace. It is secured with bend tabs on either side. Lay the extension in front of the base then secure by bending tabs on each side over to secure to the base. While this piece is provided it is not required.

Step 12. INSTALLER INSTRUCTIONS - ATTACHING SAFETY IN OPERATION WARNINGS

Affix the label to the surface of the plate of the wall receiver that controls the fireplace (*Figure A*). Choose the language primarily spoken in the home. If unknown, affix the English language label.
- Locate the remote control transmitter and clean it thoroughly to remove any dust and oils. Affix the label to the surface of handheld transmitter (*Figure B*). Choose the language primarily spoken in the home. If unknown, affix the English language label.

- Locate the wall receiver that controls the fireplace (verify the switch operates the fireplace by turning it on and off). Clean the wall receiver plate thoroughly to remove any dust and oils. Affix the label to the surface of the plate of the wall receiver that controls the fireplace (*Figure A*). Choose the language primarily spoken in the home.
- Locate the remote control transmitter and clean it thoroughly to remove any dust and oils. Affix the label to the surface of handheld transmitter (*Figure B*). Choose the language primarily spoken in the home.

GENERAL INFORMATION

The fireplace models covered in this manual are direct-vent, sealed combustion gas fireplaces designed for residential, commercial, and manufactured home applications. Direct-vent appliances operate with the combustion chamber completely isolated from the indoor environment.

All air for combustion is brought in from the outside and exhaust gases are vented through the same direct-vent, co-axial (intake/exhaust) vent system.

These electronic appliances are designed to operate on natural gas and have an electronic intermittent pilot ignition system. External 120 Volt AC electrical power is is required to operate these units.

These appliances comply with National Safety Standards and are tested and listed by PFS TECO (Report No. F14-106) to ANSI Z21.50b-2009 (in Canada, CGA 2.22b-2009), and CAN/CGA-2.17-M91 (R2009) in both the USA and Canada, as vented gas fireplaces.

The Installation must conform to local codes or, in the absence of local codes, with the National Fuel Gas Code, ANSI Z223.1/NFPA 54 - latest edition, or the Natural Gas Installation Code, CAN/CGA B149.1 - latest edition. The appliance, when installed, must be electrically grounded in accordance with local codes or, in the absence of local codes, with the National Electrical Code, ANSI/NFPA 70 - latest edition, or the Canadian Electrical Code, CSA C22.1 - latest edition.

Test gauge connections are provided on the front of the gas control valve, identified IN for the inlet and OUT for the manifold side (see *Figure 1* on *Page 6*). The control valve has a 3/8" (10 mm) NPT thread inlet and outlet side of the valve.

The appliance and its appliance main gas valve must be disconnected from the gas supply piping system during any pressure testing of that system at test pressures **in excess of** 1/2 psi (3.5 kPa).

The appliance must be isolated from the gas supply piping system by closing its equipment shutoff valve during any pressure testing of the gas supply piping system at test pressures **equal to or less than** 1/2 psi (3.5 kPa).

Orifice Sizes - Sea Level to High Altitude (All Models)

These appliances are tested and approved for installation at elevations of 0-4500 feet (0-1372 meters) above sea level using the standard burner orifice sizes (marked with an "*" in **Table 16**).

For elevations above 4500 feet, contact your gas supplier or qualified service technician.

Burn-in Period

During the first few fires of this appliance there will be some odor due to the curing of the paint and burning off of lubricants used in the manufacturing process. Depending on your use, the burn-in period may take a few hours or a few days.

KEEP YOUR HOUSE WELL VENTILATED DURING THE CURING PROCESS. THE ODOR AND HAZE EMITTED DURING THE CURING PROCESS CAN BE QUITE NOTICEABLE AND MAY SET OFF A SMOKE DETECTOR.

NOTICE: A white film may develop on the glass enclosure panel during the first few fires as part of the burn-in process.

The first few times you use the fireplace, clean the glass after each use (AFTER THE GLASS HAS COMPLETELY COOLED); otherwise, the white film will bake onto the glass and become difficult to remove.

OPERATION AND CARE OF YOUR APPLIANCE

WARNING

Young children should be carefully supervised when they are in the same room as the appliance. Toddlers, young children and others may be susceptible to accidental contact burns. A physical barrier is recommended if there are at risk individuals in the house. To restrict access to a fireplace or stove, install an adjustable safety gate to keep toddlers, young children and other at risk individuals out of the room and away from hot surfaces.




Figure 46 - Control Compartment with Access Panel Removed


Appliance Operation

To light the appliance refer to the detailed lighting instructions (see *Pages 48 and 49*). The appliance lighting instructions may also be found on the pull out lighting instruction labels attached to the gas control valve.

Your appliance is equipped with a Wall ON/ REMOTE/OFF switch, remote control, and the appliance main burner may be turned on and off using either switch.

PURGE CYCLE

This is a power vented fireplace that requires household electrical power to operate. It will not operate during a power failure. When the fireplace is turned OFF, the exhaust blower will continue to operate for approximately fifteen seconds after shutdown to expel the exhaust gases from the venting system.



Remote Control System

The remote control and receiver allow you to command the functions of your fireplace from the comfort of your chair. They are configured to control the primary burner operation, its flame levels (through six levels) and provide ON/OFF and smart control of this appliance.

The control board connects directly to the gas valve and stepper motor (see *Wire Diagram* on *Page 47*).

The control is powered by four (4) AA batteries in the wall switch and/or 120 VAC line power.

The control accepts commands via radio frequency from the transmitter and does not require line-of-sight operation.

The ON/REMOTE/OFF switch can be set to one of three positions:

- ON (manual override)
- REMOTE (remote control)
- OFF

Initializing the System for the First Time

Install four (4) AA batteries into the receiver battery bay, behind the wall switch plate.

NOTE: Install the batteries into the battery bay as indicated on the battery cover. Ensure that batteries are installed with proper polarity (+/-).

Place the ON/REMOTE/OFF switch in the REMOTE position (see *Figure 48* on *Page 38*). Insert the end of the paper clip (or other similar object) into the hole marked "PRG" on the receiver front cover. The control board, located in the fireplace, will "beep" three (3) times to indicate that it is ready to synchronize with a transmitter.

Install three (3) AAA batteries in the transmitter battery bay, located on the base of the transmitter. With the batteries installed in the transmitter, push the ON button. The receiver will "beep" four (4) times to indicate the transmitter command has been accepted and is set to the particular code of that transmitter. The system is now initialized.

Low Battery Power Detection

The life span of the receiver batteries depends on various factors:

- · Quality of the batteries used
- Number of ignitions of the appliance
- etc.

When the receiver batteries are low, no "beep" will be emitted from the receiver when it receives an ON/OFF command from the transmitter. This is an alert for a low battery condition for the receiver. When the batteries are replaced the "beep" will be emitted from the receiver when the ON/OFF key is pressed (See *Initializing the System for the First Time*).

When the transmitter batteries are low, a battery icon will appear on the LCD display of the transmitter before all battery power is lost. When the batteries are replaced this icon will disappear.

A

WARNING

Fire Hazard. Can cause severe injury or death. The receiver causes ignition of the appliance. The appliance can turn on suddenly. Keep away from the appliance burner when operating the remote system or activating manual bypass of the remote system.

CAUTION: Property damage hazard. Excessive heat can cause property damage. The appliance can stay lit for many hours. Turn off the appliance if it is not going to be attended for any length of time. Always place the Transmitter where children can not reach it. Control will automatically shut off after 24 hrs of continued operation

Temperature Indicator Display

With the system in the OFF position, press the Room Temperature Key and the Mode Key at the same time (see *Figure 49* on *Page 38*). Look at the LCD screen on the transmitter to verify that a "C" or "F" is visible to the right of the Room Temperature display (see *Figure 50* on *Page 38*).

Turn ON the Appliance

With the receiver switch in the REMOTE position, press the ON/OFF Key on the transmitter. The transmitter display will show all active icons on the screen. At the same time, the receiver connects to the gas valve coil and the appliance main burner turns on. A single "beep" from the receiver will confirm reception of the command.

Turn OFF the Appliance

Press the ON/OFF Key on the transmitter. The transmitter LCD display will only show the room temperature and icon. At the same time, the receiver disconnects the gas valve coil and the appliance burner turns off. A single "beep" from the receiver confirms reception of the command.

Remote Flame Control

The system has six (6) flame levels. See *Figure* 51 on *Page* 38 for an example. With the system on, and the flame level at the maximum in the appliance, pressing the Down Arrow Key once will reduce the flame height by one step until the flame is turned OFF.


The Up Arrow key will increase the flame height each time it is pressed. If the Up Arrow key is pressed while the system is ON but the flame is OFF, the flame will come on in the high position (see *Figure 52* on *Page 38*). A single "beep will confirm reception of the command.




If the batteries of the receiver or transmitter are low or depleted, the appliance can be turned on manually by sliding the ON/REMOTE/OFF slider switch to the ON position. This will bypass the remote control feature of the system and the appliance main burner will come on if the gas valve is in the ON position.











Lighting the Appliance

To light electronic appliances refer to the detailed lighting instructions found on *Page 48* of these instructions. Instructions can also be found on the pull-out lighting instruction labels attached to the gas control valve.

POWER VENT OPERATION

Operating Instructions for the Appliance

To turn ON the appliance with the receiver:

- 1. Manually slide the ON/REMOTE/OFF switch to the ON position.
- 2. Blower should start immediately.
- 3. Igniter starts sparking and pilot will light.
- 4. Burner should light after a few seconds.

To turn ON the appliance with the remote transmitter:

- Manually slide the ON/REMOTE/OFF switch to the REMOTE position, then press the ON/ OFF key on the transmitter.
- 2. Blower should start immediately.
- 3. Igniter starts sparking and pilot will light.
- 4. Burner should light after a few seconds.

To Turn OFF

- Manually slide the ON/REMOTE/OFF switch to the OFF position or press the ON/OFF key on the transmitter.
- 2. Burner and pilot should turn off immediately.
- 3. Blower will continue to run for about 15 seconds, then the blower will stop.

MAINTENANCE



Inspect Venting System

NOTE: Prior to the first use of the fireplace and each burn season and periodically during the burn season, inspect the horizontal termination for debris such as bird nests, leaves, paper or branches.

Remove any items from the surfaces of the termination prior to use. Also be aware of shrubs and plantings that may encroach on the termination.

The appliance and venting system should be thoroughly inspected before initial use and at least annually by a qualified service technician (inspection should include ensuring that exhaust or intake passages are unobstructed and vent components are properly assembled and not damaged). Homeowner must contact a qualified service technician at once if any abnormal condition is observed.

If the venting system is disassembled for any reason, a qualified service technician should follow vent installation instructions for proper reassembly and proper sealing of the venting system components. However, more frequent periodic inspections and cleanings should be performed by the homeowner.

Glass Cleaning

See Front Glass Enclosure Panel, Removal and Installation on **Page 40**.

NOTE: Clean glass after first two weeks of operation (after Burn-In period is over) and then only when necessary and when the fireplace is cool. Wipe surface with clean, dampened, soft cloth. Follow with a dry, soft towel as desired. Take care not to scratch the glass surface.

WARNING: Do not use abrasive cleaners on glass. Never clean the glass when it is hot.

The viewing glass should be cleaned periodically to remove any build-up caused from the following:

- During start-up, it is normal for condensation to form on the inside of the glass (this condensation and fog will usually disappear in a few minutes). The moisture can cause lint, dust and other airborne particles to cling to the glass surface.
- Initial curing of the high temperature paint and burning off of lubricants used in the manufacturing process may result in a film on the glass.
- A white coating may form on the glass as a result of impurities and minerals in the fuel.

It is recommended that the glass be cleaned two or three times during each burning season, depending on the circumstances present. The following cleaning solutions are approved for use to clean glass:

- Non-ammonia based household cleaner
- 50/50 mix of white vinegar & water
- · Gas fireplace/stove glass cleaner

Inspect Glass Gasket

Visually inspect the gasket on the backside of the glass enclosure panels. The gasket surface must be clean, free of irregularities and seated firmly.

Clean Control Compartment

Keep control compartment clean by vacuuming or brushing at least twice a year. More frequent cleaning may be required due to excessive lint from carpeting, bedding materials, etc. It is important that control compartments, burners and circulating air passageways of the appliance be kept clean.

Clean Logs and Burner

Carefully remove the logs (use care when handling the fiber logs, as they become quite fragile after curing). Vacuum out any foreign matter (lint, carbon, etc.) on the burner. Ensure the burner ports are "open." Remove any carbon deposits from the under side of the logs using a vacuum cleaner, or a soft bristled brush (i.e. paint brush).

NOTE: Improperly positioned logs can create carbon build-up and will alter the performance of the appliance.

Replacing Logs

If the logs become damaged by accident or improper handling and need replacement, use only the proper replacement logs from manufacturer (see *Page 46* for ordering information).

Re-install Embers, Volcanic stone and Logs
Carefully follow placement instructions on
Pages 42 and 43). All logs should fit onto

Pages 42 and 43). All logs should fit onto corresponding pins and/or log stoppers. This will ensure a proper flame and safe combustion.

Inspect Wiring

Refer to wiring diagram on Page 47.

CAUTION: Label all wires prior to disconnection when servicing controls. Wiring errors can cause improper and dangerous operation. Verify proper operation after servicing.

Inspect and clean all wire connections. Ensure there is no melting or other damage. Inspection should include:

- · Terminals at the valve
- Wall ON/REMOTE/OFF switch

Low Battery Power Detection

The life span of the remote control system batteries depends on many factors:

- the quality of the batteries used
- the number of appliance ignitions
- etc

When the batteries are low, the receiver will emit two (2) beeps (low battery alert) when it receives a command from the transmitter.

After the batteries are replaced, the receiver will emit one (1) beep when it receives a command from the transmitter. See "Initialization of the System" in the Installation Instructions.

Inspect Burner Flame and Pilot Flame Appearance

Periodically do a visual check of the burner flame and the pilot flame. Ensure that the burner flame appearance resembles the flame shown in *Figure 63* and as described in *Flame Appearance and Sooting* on *Page 44*. Refer to *Figure 64 on Page 44* for more information about the pilot flame appearance. Contact a qualified service technician at once if any abnormal condition is observed.

Small Area Paint Touch-up

Only use a factory supplied paint kit for touchups. Paint is available at your local Innovative Hearth Products dealer. Never attempt to paint a hot fireplace.

If the surface later becomes stained or marred, it may be lightly sanded and touched up with spray paint.

Front Glass Enclosure Panel Removal and Installation

A WARNING

- When reinstalling the glass door, the door latch screws must be securely tightened to prevent the glass door from falling out, which could potentially cause damage and possible injury.
- Do not attempt to substitute the materials used on this door, or replace cracked or broken glass.
- Handle this glass with extreme care! Glass is susceptible to damage - Do not scratch or handle roughly while reinstalling the glass door frame.
- The glass door of this appliance must only be replaced as a complete unit as provided by the manufacturer. Do not attempt to replace broken, cracked or chipped glass separately.
- Do not attempt to touch the front enclosure glass with your hands while the fireplace is in use.

WARNING

Do not operate appliance with the glass front removed, cracked or broken.

The door should easily close without needing to be pressed down. If it has to be pressed down to close, the gasket in the top of the door should be dressed so it lays on the glass.

These are direct-vent appliances. They are designed to operate only when the front glass enclosure panel is installed. Generally the front glass enclosure panel should not be removed except to gain access to the components within the firebox.

Removing Glass Enclosure Panel (see *Figure 55*)

Remove the door modesty shield from the top flange glass door by pulling it up firmly with both hands until it is disengaged. Using a phillips screwdriver, unfasten two (2) screws located at the top of the glass frame.

Tilt the glass frame at the top away from the unit. Lift it carefully off the bottom door track and set the door aside, protecting it from inadvertent damage.

Barrier (see Notice, Page 41)

This fireplace comes with a barrier to reduce the likelihood of burns from touching hot glass. If the barrier is damaged, the fireplace should be turned off immediately and the fireplace must not be operated until a new, approved factory barrier for this unit is installed.

To remove barrier follow these steps.

- 1. Lift barrier up by the frame at the top.
- 2. Remove lower filler piece by pulling down off of the barrier.
- 3. Lower barrier and push barrier to left to release right side.
- 4. Pull the right side out of fireplace.
- 5. Remove screen.
- Install the new, approved factory barrier with flat side of screen toward firebox.

To install the front glass door assembly, proceed as follows:


- 1. Retrieve the glass door assembly. Visually inspect the gasket on the backside of the panel. The gasket surface must be clean, free of irregularities and seated firmly.
- 2. Position the door frame in front of the firebox opening and engage the bottom flange over the rail at the bottom of the firebox opening.
- 3. Swing the door up and back. Ensure the gasket seats evenly as the door draws shut. Engage the nut insert and fasten with two screws to secure the door.
- 4. Install the door modesty shield on top flange glass door as follows: grab the door modesty shield with both hands, with the open hem going down and engage it with the upper lip of the glass door frame by pushing it all the way down. Make sure the installed shield is firmly in place.



INSTALL VOLCANIC STONE, GLOWING EMBERS, AND LOGS

A WARNING

- DO NOT attempt to install the logs until the appliance installation has been completed, the gas line connected and tested for leaks and the initial burner operation has been checked out.
- The size and position of the log set was engineered to give the appliance a safe, reliable and attractive flame pattern. Any attempt to use a different log set in the fireplace will void the warranty and will result in incomplete combustion, sooting, and poor flame quality.
- Logs get very hot and will remain hot up to one hour after gas supply is turned OFF. Handle only when logs are cool. Turn OFF all electricity to the appliance before you install grate, volcanic stone, embers and logs.
- This appliance is not designed to burn wood. Any attempt to do so could cause irreparable damage to the appliance and prove hazardous to your safety.
- If logs are not installed according to the log installation instructions, flame impingement and improper combustion could occur and result in soot and/or excessive production of carbon monoxide (CO), a colorless, odorless, toxic gas.

NOTE: It is important to ensure proper log and or media placement per the manual when installing these units. Verify pilot flame is not obstructed. See Verifying Appliance Operation on **Page 24**.

- **Step 1.** Install the ceramic or porcelain panels, per the instructions provided in kit.




Figure 56 - Volcanic Stone Placement

- Step 2. Place volcanic stone around the burner, as shown in Figure 56.




Figure 57 - Glowing Embers Separation






Figure 58 - Glowing Embers Placement

- Step 3. Separate the glowing embers from the larger bag into pieces about the size of a quarter, as shown in *Figure 57*. Mix the glowing embers with the bag of platinum embers also provided with the fireplace. Keep the pieces fluffed, not matted. Distribute these pieces over the burner as shown in *Figure 58*. Do not use more glowing embers than necessary. When properly positioned, the glowing embers will cover approximately 75% of the burner for natural gas applications.

NOTE: Excessive use of glowing embers may result in sooting or poor flame. This appliance is provided with enough glowing embers for several applications. Do not use all provided, in one application. For best glowing effect, replace the ember material annually. Replacement volcanic stone, glowing embers, and platinum embers are available (see Table 17).

Step 4. Position the individual logs as shown in *Figure 59* through *Figure 62* on *Page 43*. Logs should be placed in the order shown. Place logs 2 and 3 against the pins on the grate, NOT over them.

Proper log and twig placement is critical to encourage outstanding flame appearance and prevent sooting. When positioned properly as shown, twigs will be positioned between flame peaks and will not impinge any flames.





Figure 60 - Placing Log 2

Figure 61 - Placing Logs 3 and 4




Figure 62 - Placing Logs 5, 6, and 7

BURNER ADJUSTMENTS (QUALIFIED TECHNICIANS ONLY)

Flame Appearance and Sooting

Proper flame appearance is a flame which is blue at the base and becomes yellow-orange in the body of the flame. When the appliance is first lit, the entire flame may be blue and will gradually turn yellow-orange during the first 15 minutes of operation. After 15 minutes of operation, if the flame is blue, or if the flame is orange with evidence of sooting (black tip), the air shutter opening may need to be adjusted.

If the air shutter opening is closed too far, sooting may develop. Sooting is indicated by black puffs developing at the tips of very long orange flames. Sooting results in black deposits forming on the logs, appliance inside surfaces and on exterior surfaces adjacent to the vent termination. Sooting is caused by incomplete combustion in the flames and lack of combustion air entering the air shutter opening. To achieve a warm yellow-orange flame with an orange body that does not soot, the shutter opening must be adjusted between these two extremes.

Air Shutter Adjustment Guidelines

- If there is smoke or soot present, first check the log set positioning to ensure that the flames are not impinging on any of the logs.
 If the log set is properly positioned and a sooting condition still exists, then the air shutter opening should be increased.
- The more offsets in the vent system, the larger the air shutter opening will need to be.
- An appliance operated with the air shutter opened too far, may have flames that appear blue and transparent. These weak, blue and transparent flames are termed anemic.

The following chart is provided to aid you in achieving the correct air shutter adjustment for your installation.

Amount of Primary Air	Flame Color	Air Shutter Adjustment
If air shutter is closed too far	Flame will be orange	Air shutter gap should be increased
If air shutter is open too far	Flame will be blue	Air shutter gap should be decreased




Figure 63 - Burner Flame Appearance

Burner Air Shutter Adjustment Procedure

A WARNING

- Air shutter adjustment should only be performed by a qualified professional service technician.
- Ensure that the front glass door assembly is in place and sealed After adjustment.

A CAUTION

Soot will be produced if the air shutter is closed too much. Any damage due to carboning resulting from improperly setting the air shutter is not covered under the warranty.

The following paragraphs address burner adjustment concerns and procedures.

When lit for the first time, this appliance will emit a slight odor for an hour or two. This is due to the "burn-in" of internal paints and lubricants used in the manufacturing process.

Adjustment

To adjust the flame, move the adjustment air shutter (located on the lower venturi) back or forward to increase or reduce the air shutter opening, respectively. **Position the air shutter to the factory setting as shown in** *Table* **20.** Allow the burner to operate for at least 15 minutes. Observe the flame continuously. If it appears weak or sooty as previously described, adjust the air shutter until the flame appearance is as desired.

When satisfied that the appliance operates properly, leave the wall ON/REMOTE/OFF switch in REMOTE position and turn the remote switch OFF.




Check Flame Patterns and Flame Height	Qualified Service Technician	Refer to <i>Figure 63 on Page 44</i> and verify the flame pattern and height displayed by the appliance conforms to the picture. Flames must not impinge on the logs. Ensure flames are steady (not lifting or floating).
Inspect/Clean Pilot and Burner	Qualified Service Technician	Refer to <i>Figure 64 on Page 45</i> . Remove any surface build-up on pilot and burner assembly. Wipe the pilot nozzles, igniter/flame rod and hood. Ensure the pilot flame engulfs the flame sensor as shown.
Check Vent System	Qualified Service Technician	Inspect the vent system at the top and at the base (within the firebox) for signs of blockage or obstruction. Look for any signs of dislocation or deterioration of the vent components. NOTE: Excessive condensation can cause corrosion of caps, pipe, and fittings (excessive condensation can be caused by long lateral runs, too many elbows and/or exterior portions of the system being exposed to cold weather). Also, inspect wall straps or plumbers's tape to ensure it is secure and in place.





The product body, firebox and barrier carry the 20 Year Limited Warranty. Ceramic glass carries the 20 Year Limited Warranty against thermal breakage only. After installation, if covered components manufactured by IHP are found to be defective in materials or workmanship during the 20 Year Limited Warranty period and while the Product remains at the site of the original installation, IHP will, at its option, repair or replace the covered components. If repair or replacement is not commercially practical, IHP will, at its option, refund the purchase price or wholesale price of the IHP product, whichever is applicable. IHP will also pay IHP prevailing labor rates, as determined in its sole discretion, incurred in repairing or replacing such components for up to five years. THERE ARE EXCLUSIONS AND LIMITATIONS to this 20 Year Limited Warranty as described herein.

COVERAGE COMMENCEMENT DATE

Warranty coverage begins on the date of purchase. In the case of new home construction, warranty coverage begins on the date of first occupancy of the dwelling or six months after the sale of the Product by an independent IHP dealer/distributor, whichever occurs earlier. The warranty shall commence no later than 24 months following the date of product shipment from IHP, regardless of the installation or occupancy date.

FXCLUSIONS AND LIMITATIONS

This 20 Year Limited Warranty applies only if the Product is installed in the United States or Canada and only if operated and maintained in accordance with the printed instructions accompanying the Product and in compliance with all applicable installation and building codes and good trade practices.

This warranty is non-transferable and extends to the original owner only. The Product must be purchased through a listed supplier of IHP and proof of purchase must be provided. The product body, firebox and barrier carry the 20 Year Limited Warranty from the date of installation. Vent components, trim components and paint are excluded from this 20 Year Limited Warranty. The following do not carry the 20 Year Limited Warranty but are warranted as follows:

Burner - Repair or replacement for one year from the date of installation

Gas components - Repair or replacement for one year from the date of installation

Gaskets - Repair or replacement for one year from the date of installation

Logs - Replacement for one year from the date of installation against thermal breakage only

Optional blowers & remote controls - Repair or replacement for one year from the date of installation

Optional glass doors - Repair or replacement for 90 days from the date of installation

Tempered glass - Replacement for one year from the date of installation

Labor coverage - Prevailing IHP labor rates apply for the warranty period of the component

Parts not otherwise listed carry a 90 day warranty from the date of installation.

Whenever practicable, IHP will provide replacement parts, if available, for a period of 10 years from the last date of manufacture of the Product.

IHP will not be responsible for: (a) damages caused by normal wear and tear, accident, riot, fire, flood or acts of God; (b) damages caused by abuse, negligence, misuse, or unauthorized alteration or repair of the Product affecting its stability or performance (The Product must be subjected to normal use. The Product is designed to burn either natural or propane gas only. Burning conventional fuels such as wood, coal or any other solid fuel will cause damage to the Product, will produce excessive temperatures and could result in a fire hazard.); (c) damages caused by failing to provide proper maintenance and service in accordance with the instructions provided with the Product; (d) damages, repairs or inefficiency resulting from faulty installation or application of the Product.

IHP is not responsible for inadequate fireplace system draft caused by air conditioning and heating systems, mechanical ventilation systems, or general construction conditions which may generate negative pressure in the room in which the appliance is installed. Additionally IHP assumes no responsibility for drafting conditions caused by venting configurations, adjoining trees or buildings, adverse wind conditions or unusual environmental factors and conditions that affect the operation of the unit.

This 20 Year Limited Warranty covers only parts and labor as provided herein. In no case shall IHP be responsible for materials, components or construction, which are not manufactured or supplied by IHP or for the labor necessary to install, repair or remove such materials, components or construction. Additional utility bills incurred due to any malfunction or defect in equipment are not covered by this warranty. All replacement or repair components will be shipped F.O.B. from the nearest stocking IHP factory.

IHP reserves the right to investigate any and all claims against this 20 Year Limited Warranty and to decide, in its sole discretion, upon the method of settlement.
